TEGUCIGALPA.- A raíz del reportaje publicado por **LA TRIBUNA**, sobre los vecinos del cerro El Berrinche, miembros de la "Iglesia de Cristo" se desplazaron hasta la zona para ayudar a más de 30 familias que residen en casuchas de cartón, sin contar con agua, energía eléctrica y mucho menos un empleo digno para enfrentarse cada día con la pobreza.

En la Navidad del 2007, dentro del compromiso de este rotativo con los más desposeídos del país, miles de lectores se conmovieron al conocer del hambre, frío y enfermedades de los pobladores de este sector.

Los niños de pies descalzos jugando con pelotas desinfladas en los callejones de tierra, las ancianas cocinando bajo los inclementes rayos del sol y la desesperanza reflejada en el rostro de padres y madres, por no tener dinero para alimentar a sus hijos, "tocaron" el corazón del coordinador de la "Iglesia de Cristo" en Honduras, Santos Erlindo Núñez.



"Gracias a mi Señor Jesucristo, porque no nos desampara, anteayer tuve un sueño, miraba que alguien venía con algo bonito y hoy se hizo realidad", dijo María Rivera, de 82 años, sentada a la par de un barril convertido en fogón.

El pasado 14 de febrero, Día del Amor y la Amistad, Núñez se desplazó hacia El Berrinche para entregarles a los residentes del lugar zapatos, colchonetas y baldes plásticos, entre otros implementos para el hogar y prendas de vestir.

Muchas personas de escasos recursos económicos de la colonia "El Porvenir", próxima a El Berrinche, se beneficiaron también con la obra de caridad impulsada por la iglesia.

La donación proviene de Estados Unidos, donde el coordinador general de la obra social es el predicador internacional John Kachelman, quien se dedica a recolectar artículos, entre los que figuran zapatos y ropa.

Julissa Ávila Reina, de 10 años, alumna del quinto grado de la Escuela Álvaro Contreras, no paraba de sonreír al recibir nuevos zapatos.

Además de ayudar a los más necesitados de Honduras, el norteamericano, junto a su iglesia, se han trazado la meta de paliar la pobreza en los demás países de Centroamérica, llegando hasta comunidades donde los moradores no satisfacen siquiera sus necesidades básicas.

La iglesia también ha ayudado a Sudán y Ucrania y aunque comenzó recolectando productos ya usados, ahora la mayor parte de las ayudas son ropa y utensilios domésticos nuevos, debido a la credibilidad y transparencia alcanzada por la organización religiosa en numerosos países.

Recientemente, la Sala de Rehabilitación Ortopédica del Hospital Escuela fue dotada con equipo médico enviado por "La iglesia de Cristo", ubicada en Judsonia, Arkansas, Estados Unidos.

También en coordinación con el Despacho de la Primera Dama, Xiomara de Zelaya, se donó un equipo de diálisis a dicho centro asistencial.

Núñez manifestó que para que las ayudas se estén concretando ha sido importante la intervención de la funcionaria de la Secretaría de Relaciones Exteriores, Patricia Santander y también de Leslie Pineda, por parte de Casa Presidencial.

Agregó que la iglesia en varias ocasiones ha traído a Honduras brigadas médicas, víveres y en ciertas oportunidades ha construido viviendas para los indigentes.

El coordinador de la "Iglesia de Cristo" concluyó manifestando que uno de los principios del templo es no pedir diezmos, porque consideran que las ofrendas deben ser voluntarias y no forzadas.

De esta manera, llevando las enseñanzas de Jesús en el corazón, los miembros de la "Iglesia de Cristo" recorren cientos de pueblos alrededor del mundo, como embajadores de la palabra y del amor, dando abrigo y comida a quienes la miseria les ha arrebatado hasta la fe.

"Thanks to Christ and His Father!"

Exclaimed this 90 years old woman when she received a pair of shoes, an empty bucky and a mattress from the hand of a little boy in the name of Christ

This old lady live in a community named El Berrinche, it is located less than one mile far from the National Congress Building, in Tegucigalpa, she has a sister who is 82 years old and a grand daughter. Sitting down on the earth, beside her is her kitchen that is founded over two old used tires, two barrels and a bucky. That is where she cooks from time to time.



This time her fire is put out, there is not smoke, it mean there is nothing to eat for this day, this woman told us she had made a special prayer three nights ago to God, inside her there was expectation that God was going to answer her request and it happened three days later!

It is then when we (Efraín Banegas, Journalist, Tiburcio a member of the church, Joshua, my son and me) arrived surprisingly

and stopped in front of her.

Mr. Efraín Banegas had made a special report of the situation these people were living and published it by the newspaper in December last year, he also was surprised to hear an answer from people who care about people and they are the churches of Christ.

Thanks to all those who are involved in this great effort, without any of you it would not have been possible, more than eighty families were benefited in this community, some received tennis shoes, mattress and a bucky, others received only shoes, or empty buckies.



Everyone wanted a bucky or an empty box! It serve to them for many things they need to do, for instance carrying water from the river, the river is contaminated.

They all expressed thanks to the church, they were told this help came from the churches of Christ in the United States and we were only passing this great blessing to them.

I want to let you know what a woman said, she told us, "You are good church" and asked for the address where the church meets. That woman said there was a church in Honduras (that church was started in brazilian) that promised them some help, they visited that church one day and they offered them a soap what they call is consagrated but the ones who want that soap have to give money in return, she said that church was not a true church who are making business with the people.

I could observe in the eyes of the people who reflect anxiety and desperation for the actual situation they are passing.

I also want to make mention that this community is settled in a land that sank and some slide of the earth happened when the Hurrricane Mitch happened in October 1998.

Those people have been forced by the government to abandom that place because it is a zone of high risk but they do not have another place where to go to.



Those people urge to be feed, they need clothes, beds, blankets etc.

How to feel about living in a place without clothes, shoes, refrigerator, air conditioner, toys, children without underwear, no latrines in some homes, no enough food to be nurtured. They are with a lot of mosquitoes because they are near to the river, etc.

Thanks God for using people like you! *"Only [they would] that we should remember the poor; the same which I also was forward to do"* (Galatians 2:10).

May God bless you and reward you someday in Heaven.
